Annual Vestry & Parochial Church Meetings: Lavenham – Wednesday 24 April 7pm; Preston St Mary – Sunday 14 April 7pm. At the Annual Vestry Meeting two Churchwardens are elected for a term of one year. As the office of churchwarden is a public office held on behalf of the whole community, the vestry meeting is open to all residents of the village. Those entitled to vote for churchwardens include anyone on the electoral roll of the parish church and anyone who lives in the village whose name is on the register of local government electors. The second part of the meeting is the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), when we consider the annual accounts and activities of the church, and give thanks for all that we have shared together. It is also a meeting at which elections take place for membership of the Parochial Church Council (PCC). If you are interested in standing as Churchwarden or in joining the PCC will find nomination forms at the back of church in Lavenham, or speak to the churchwardens. To vote at the APCM you need to be on the Church Electoral Roll – please speak to the Churchwardens if you are not, but would like to be.

**Passion Gospel:** Next week (Palm Sunday) at the 10.15am service, a dramatized reading of the Passion Gospel will replace the sermon – if you would like to take part please speak to the Rector, and note that there will be a rehearsal on Thursday, 21 March, at 3.45pm (note change of time).

**MU Lady Day Service:** Friday 22 March 11.00am. Although this service is organised by the Mothers' Union in Suffolk, it is open to all, and everyone is very welcome to join them in celebration of the feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Holy Week 2024: Holy week is the most important week of the Christian year. During this week we remember the events of the final week in Jerusalem that led Jesus to the cross. These events include his entry to the city on Palm Sunday (the 10.15 service will include a Palm procession and the reading of the Passion Gospel), the last supper with his disciples (Maundy Thursday – 7pm at Lavenham), his arrest, trial and crucifixion (Good Friday – 12noon at Preston and 2pm at Lavenham), and his resurrection to new life on the first Easter Day (6.30am at Preston and 8.00/10.15am at Lavenham). Compline (Monday to Wednesday 7pm at Lavenham) is a quiet meditative service of evening prayers. Please feel welcome to join us this year as we follow Christ's steps to the cross and beyond. *Pick up a handy guide to the Holy Week services at the back of church*.

**Come & Sing Stainer's Crucifixion:** Good Friday 29 March 7pm. If you would you like to join the choir for this event, please contact Kevin Slingsby, or check the website for details.

Changes to the Service Pattern: Lavenham PCC has agreed three changes to Sunday worship that will take effect from 1 April 2024 – (1) The main Sunday service will start at 10.00am instead of 10.15am; (2) The Morning Worship service previously held on the first Sunday each month will move to the third Sunday. This will create a better balance to the pattern of worship across the benefice, with Preston holding their Morning Worship on the first Sunday; (3) At 6pm on the first Sunday each month there will be a new evening service in Lavenham, starting with Evensong on 7 April. It is hoped that these simple changes will create a better balance to our worship within the benefice and an opportunity to try one or two new things. *Pick up a handy guide to the new pattern at the back of church.* 

Safeguarding Training: Face-to-face training is available locally at all levels over the next few months – Basic Awareness at St Mary the Virgin Haverhill on Saturday 23 March (10.00am–12.30pm) and Fornham All Saints Church on Friday 19 April (10.00am–12.30pm); Foundation at Lavenham Village Hall on Tuesday 16 April (2.00pm–4.30pm) or 11 May (10.00am–12.30pm); Leadership at Elmswell Church on Tuesdays 21 May & 4 June (2.30pm–4.30pm) or Boxford Church on Thursdays 25 April & 9 May (10.00am–12.30pm). Basic Awareness is accessible to everyone, and is required for everyone who has a designated role in the Church (paid or voluntary), but all parishioners are welcome and

encouraged to complete it; **Foundation** must be completed by all decision makers, including Clergy, PTOs, Elders, Readers, PCC Members, Churchwardens, Vergers and Children & Youth Workers (Basic should be completed first). The face-to-face sessions at these two levels, with a group of up to 24 people, last for two and a half hours, and the course is an exact replica of the online training module, available from the National Portal. If you would rather complete this training in your own time, online, please go to the Diocesan website where you will find the link. **Leadership** is additionally required by all Clergy, Lay Ministers, Elders, Safeguarding Officers, Directors of Music (two 1.5/2 hour sessions plus coursework) and is alternatively available via Zoom sessions. If you are unsure which level is right for you, please check with Mary Jackson. *To book a place or for the online portal there is a link on the website home page*.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

## Glory to you, O Lord.

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour. 'Now my soul

is troubled. And what should I say — "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.



## Faith in Action - Transforming healthcare Monday 18 March to Sunday 24 March




The Diocesan hospital at Murgwanza provides vital healthcare to the area, serving around 365,000 people. The nearest referral hospital is an eight-hour drive away, so Murgwanza is working hard to train local specialists. Our Diocese sponsored Dr Christian Ruzige through his training as a general surgeon. We are now sponsoring Dr Elia Ethan, studying for a Master's degree in Ophthalmology at at Kilimanjaro Christian University Medical College.

Elia sends us regular updates on his progress: "Praise the Lord. The hands have started to coordinate with brain. Nice moments. I did three cataract surgeries today. I thank God, my surgical skills are becoming better day by day. God bless you for sponsoring my studies." Last year with a generous donation from a couple in Ipswich we were able to buy him a specialist 90D lens which he was able to put straight to use. He wrote: "The lens is working nicely and beautifully. Many thanks to my donors."

With money from previous Lent appeals we were also able to buy some specialist equipment for the hospital, including a blood analyser. Charles explained to Bishop Martin how to read the results.



Evelyn was trained in Murgwanza and now works at a local Health Centre where she provides basic medical care, district midwifery, pharmacy and nursing.
